


## **Hand Hygiene**

Each year in Canada, more than 200,000 patients get infections while receiving health care services. These infections can be very difficult to treat and may even be life-threatening – more than 8,000 patients die in Canada each year as a result of an infection obtained while receiving health care. **Hand Hygiene** is one of the most important ways to prevent the spread of infections, and save lives.

### 4 Moments of Hand Hygiene in Health Care:

- 1. Before initial contact with the patient or patient environment.
- 2. Before any aseptic procedure is done.
- 3. After any exposure risk to blood or bodily fluids.
- 4. After contact with the patient or patient environment.



# Wash with soap and water for 40 seconds if hands are visibly soiled! Use alcohol-based hand rub for 20 seconds if hands are not visibly soiled!
